

Thanks for everything, WHS Performing Arts! It has been a pleasure! You'll always be part of my heart."





There are so many messages in this show. Life IS a wheel. From birth to death we are on a ride and there are so many stages of living until we get to the end. This show got me thinking about so many who have gone before me and how I got to where I am now. I was fortunate to not lose any of my grandparents until I was almost 40 years old. My life has been rich with events that became beautiful memories. It's the little things that matter. (see example photo below) One memory that stands out to me is when I lost my first grandparent and I called my other grandpa (below) to tell him. His reply was this, "Well, Sugar that's a part of life." I will never forget the sound of that sentence. He knew about life on the wheel. He knew that his time on earth was closer to the end than the beginning. He had been one of those influential people who trained me to ride the wheel pretty hard. He also knew that there was an end, and it was in sight. That sentence made me pause and evaluate my position on the wheel. So does this musical. It will you too.

I have known Mindy Coblentz and her family for 30+ years. Mindy lost her momma during this show. I got to see firsthand what a sting it is. I also got to see what a community does when a member passes. We grieve, we try to move on and we pour into the young so that we can make a difference in the future world. I'm thankful to share my time on the wheel with Mindy's people.

The conclusion of this show brings the end of a season to several seniors that I have known for a long time. It's bittersweet. I love watching them grow up, but time is passing quickly and I sometimes want it to stop. To stop so I can spend a moment relishing what we have. These theatre kids have a lot of joy and happiness in their lives. You can see it on their faces as they perform. I hope you will use these next few hours to absorb the story of Winnie Foster and that it makes you a little more aware of the world around you. If yours is magical and full of wonder and beauty share it with someone who might need a kind reminder that there is good in the world.

Be the things you loved most about the people who are gone.

Just like Winnie says, "Life is the greatest wonder on earth."
